#### **Definitions:**

**Sick:** Being ill means having any symptoms and a temperature of 100 degrees or more.

**Social Distancing** – Social distancing means avoiding gathering in groups and maintaining a 6ft distance between yourself and others.

- **Programs:** When implementing programming GCS will work to offer programming in a way that limits contact, reduces class sizes, so that appropriate spacing (6ft) can be allowed between program participants and/or coaches.
- Weight Room: Social distancing can be implemented via signage, coach monitoring, and changing access to equipment in order to achieve the goal of 6ft of space between members as well as limited interactions in close space. Examples unplugging every other cardio or weight machine. Students interacting with each other will take extra precautions to maintain appropriate spacing (6ft).
- Locker Rooms or Pool Area: Social distancing can be difficult to enforce in these areas, but depending on the size of each space, signage and coach monitoring will allow us to communicate a recommended maximum number of people using the area at one time and encourage students/athletes to take precautions to minimize contact with others.
- Outdoor Playgrounds and Gyms: We will encourage students/athletes to space themselves apart from others in these areas trying to limit contact. Staff/coaches will monitor compliance with social distancing. Gym usage may be limited to a specific number of people on a court. Gym sports that can be played with social distancing measures in place may be allowed.

Personal Protective Equipment – The Center for Disease Control (CDC) now recommends, but does not require, wearing cloth face coverings (made at home or disposable) in public settings where other social distancing measures are difficult to maintain (e.g., grocery stores and pharmacies), especially in areas of significant community-based transmission.

The CDC also advises the use of simple cloth face coverings to slow the spread of the virus and help people who may have the virus and do not know it from transmitting it to others. Cloth face coverings fashioned from household items or made at home from common materials at low cost can be used as an additional, voluntary public health measure.

It is recommended to wear gloves. Employees interacting with the public will wear gloves.

Please follow the CDC instructions on proper placement, disposal, and cleaning of cloth face coverings and removal and disposal of gloves.

All staff may be required to take their temperature upon arrival at the school and record it. A temperature of 100 or more will result in the employee being sent home.

In alignment with CDC guidance, cloth face coverings are required for all staff that cannot easily practice social distancing in their position, and/or have a family member at home who is experiencing symptoms consistent with COVID-19. Cloth face coverings are required for anyone who has been exposed to a confirmed case of COVID-19. Disposable masks and/or cloth face coverings will be made available for staff who choose to use them.

No formal recommendation for all staff wearing cloth face coverings (unless CDC guidance is different) however, disposable masks and/or cloth face coverings will be made available for any staff who choose to use them. Cloth face coverings will still be required for anyone who is conducting health screenings, in childcare settings, and for anyone that has been exposed to a person with a confirmed case of COVID-19.

Greensburg Schools will have discussion concerning the Re-Entry Considerations below so that we have addressed most concerns that come from re-opening the buildings.

# Social Gatherings: Governor Holcomb's Requirements

All public and private gatherings using Greensburg School facilities (social, governmental, philanthropic or otherwise), must adhere to the following guidelines (as per the Governor's Executive Order):

- a. In Stage 1, any gathering is limited to ten (10) or fewer people who must also engage in social distancing and other sanitation measures. (through May 4, 2020).
- b. In Stage 2, any gathering is limited to twenty-five (25) or fewer people who must also engage in social distancing and other sanitation measures. (through May 24, 2020).
- c. In Stage 3, any gathering is limited to two hundred fifty (250) or fewer people who must also engage in social distancing and other sanitation measurers. (through July 4, 2020).
- d. In Stage 4, all restrictions are cancelled. (after July 4, 2020).
